BASEMENT LEVEL RENOVATIONS

GIVING OUR HIGH QUALITY MINISTRY A HIGH QUALITY SPACE

When you walk through the doors of our church campus on a typical Wednesday night, you're met with a flurry of activity! Elementary age children in their red and blue Awana vests shimmy past you in the narrow hallway, on their way to the opening festivities of Awana. You continue through the Worship Center and see up to thirty young children chattering excitedly, all smiles and giggles as they stand to say their pledges, to the flags and the Bible, respectively.

As you make your way down the stairs, you may be met with sounds of the youth group hanging out in the game room before the meeting commences, or already worshipping together in the youth room, being led in song by their peers as they joyfully praise the name of Jesus. This gathering hosts a conglomeration of teenagers from every background, walk of life, and schooling situation. But each Wednesday, no matter their status at school, their family situation at home, or the concerns on their minds for the rest of the week, they are a family. And the youth room is their home.



We often say that the "church is not the building, it's the people," which is intrinsically true. The place we gather doesn't matter as much as the people we gather with, the quality of the worship, or growth in the knowledge of God that takes place when we gather. However, to have a space that is welcoming, inviting, familiar, and friendly is so important for the teens in our student ministries. The youth room is a place where they're allowed to let their guard down, let their peers in, and let the light of scripture open their eyes to the truths they're yearning for.

But years of welcoming students and elemental wear and tear have taken their toll on this place of sanctuary for our students. The safe haven has become worn, the atmosphere, less inviting as it has begun to show physical signs of decay. Some years ago, there was significant water damage done to the basement rooms in the back walls that press into the bedrock behind our foundation, and to the linoleum flooring of nearly the entire basement.

We praise God that our water problem has been resolved through the instillation of an interior drain system and basement sump pump. Furthermore, many cosmetic updates have been completed this year including new lights, fresh coats of paint to the entire basement, and brightening each classroom with hand-painted murals throughout the downstairs portion of the building. But the most significant update of all has yet to be completed: replacing the outdated and water-damaged flooring.





The project would include all new modern-looking vinyl flooring and vinyl baseboards for the entire downstairs (excluding the maintenance room). The cost for this project comes in right under \$10,000, which includes all materials and professional installation.

We praise God for the fact that \$4,000 has already been given towards this special project! Our desire is to see the basement area of our facility become a more inviting and enjoyable space for the young people we minister to on a weekly basis. This project is special to our student ministries because it will give volunteers and students a high-quality space that reflects the high-quality ministry being accomplished there.

Student Prayer Advance | July 22-24


