WDE building a culture of discipleship

In recent days, we have been exploring the theme of disciple-making. It began with understanding the need for making disciples as we explored "Another Generation" from the book of Judges. The past three weeks has been a continuation with our sermon series "BE". We have explored themes of disciple-making such as openness, intentionality, and sacrifice. The main takeaway, however, is that disciple-making begins with **me**. I must ask the question: am I a disciple of Christ? Have I been born again? This is the most important question we can answer in life. Each one of must then ask: am I a healthy disciple? Am I growing and maturing in my relationship with the Lord? But you must not stop here! Are you multiplying yourself into other disciples? Only God can truly make disciples, but He uses His current disciples to do so (Matt. 28:18-20). We must seek after Him as a disciple, as well as seek out others to disciple. Corporate disciple-making on a large scale only begins with disciple-making on a personal level. We each have a personal responsibility to:

"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you." - Matthew 28:19-20.
